Safety: Corl Leach gave a short program regarding the FAA Wings Program. He gave a brief description of the program and how it works. He discussed how to sign up for it on the FAA.gov safety website.

Marty Maisel gave an excellent program on the XV-15 Tilt Rotor Aircraft. Marty has quite a bit of history with the project and is very knowledgeable on the subject. Marty was a member of the XV-15 Tilt Rotor Research Aircraft Project Office. Was principal investigator for several flight and wind tunnel tests. He managed the XV-15 project for the last two years of its flight test activity at Ames Research Center, Moffett Field, CA.

He gave an in-depth history of the development of tilt rotor and helicopter aircraft which led to the Development of the Bell-Boeing V-22 Osprey used by the Marines today.

Slats, flaps, tail section, and wings are all completed. Photos show working on the Corvair engine, wings, and the fuselage/controls.

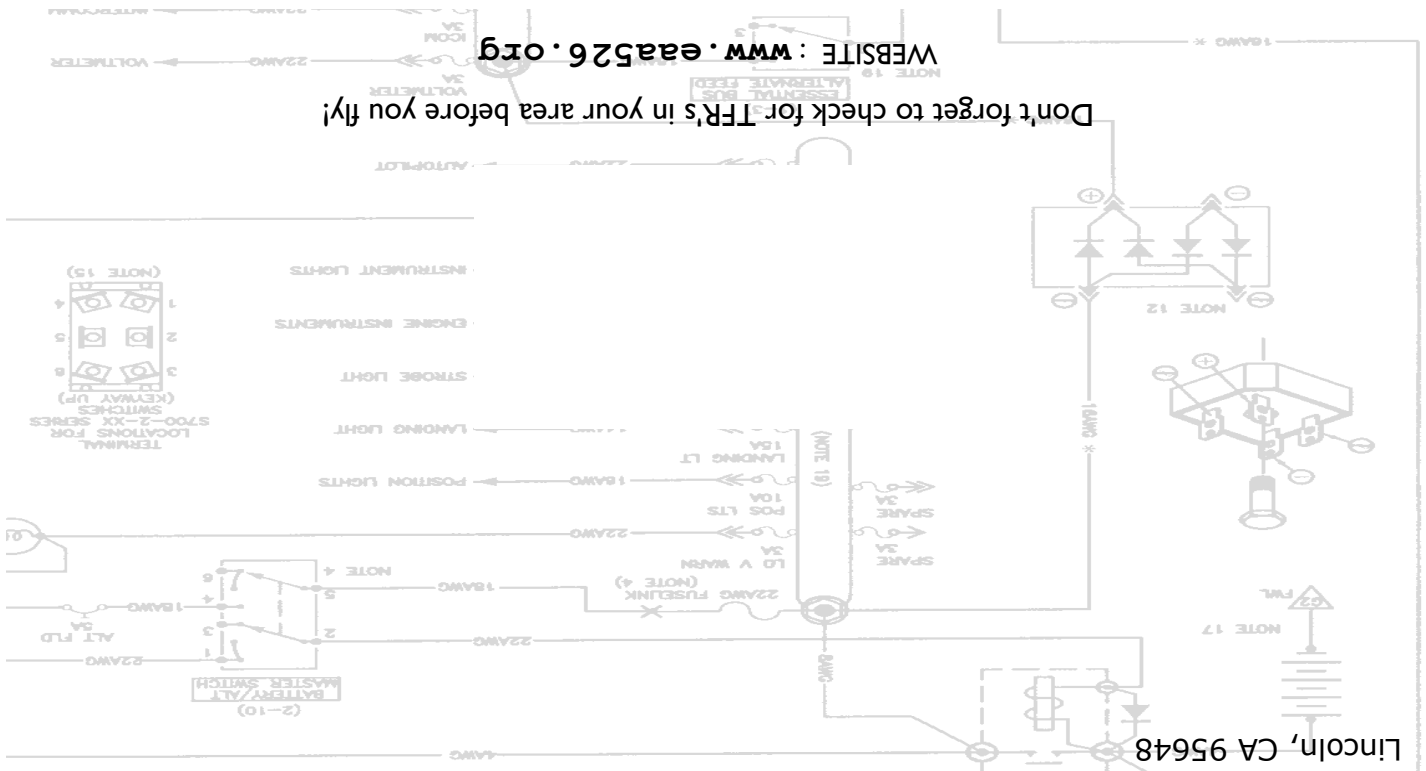
Chapter 526 2011 Delinquent Dues
